1. School / University

- Classes, lectures, group projects

2. Workplace

- Offices, companies, part-time jobs

3. Cafés & Coffee Shops

- Casual and friendly atmosphere

4. Sports Clubs & Gyms

- Football teams, fitness classes, yoga

5. Community Centers

- Local events, courses, workshops

6. Libraries

- Study groups, reading clubs

7. Volunteer Organizations

- Charity work, helping others

8. Language Courses / Language Exchange Groups

- Practicing languages with others

9. Online Communities & Social Media

- Facebook groups, forums, apps

10. Parks & Public Places

- Walking, relaxing, group activities

11. Religious Places

- Mosques, churches, community gatherings

12. Parties & Social Events

- Birthdays, weddings, celebrations

13. Cultural Events

- Exhibitions, festivals, concerts

14. Travel & Tourism

- Hotels, tours, airports

15. Neighborhood / Local Area

- Neighbors, local shops

Places where you give your name and address

1. Library – when getting a library card
2. School / University – registration forms
3. Hospital / Clinic – patient registration
4. Bank – opening an account
5. Post Office – sending official mail
6. Hotel – checking in
7. Government offices – ID cards, passports
8. Online shopping websites – delivery information
9. Job applications – forms and contracts
10. Phone or Internet companies – service registration

The Present Simple

The Present Simple is used in the following situations:

1. To talk about facts and general truths. Things that are always true or true in general.

Example:

- The sun rises in the east.
- I live in New York.

2. To talk about habits and routines. Actions that happen regularly or repeatedly.

Example:

- I wake up at 7 a.m.
- She studies every day.

3. To talk about permanent situations. Things that are true for a long time.

Example:

- I work in a bank.
- He is a student.

4. To ask questions and give information ,Especially in formal or service situations (shops, libraries, offices).

Examples from the dialogue:

- Can I help you?
- Do you have an e-mail address?
- Are you a student?

5. To express opinions, feelings, and states with stative verbs (think, like, know, need, want).

Example:

- I think this book is interesting.
- I need your address.

6. To talk about schedules and timetables(For future meaning but using present simple.)

Example:

- The library opens at 9 a.m.
- The class starts tomorrow.

Vocabulary with meaning

1. **Librarian/** A person who works in a library and helps people find books or information.
2. **Library card/** A card that allows you to borrow books from a library.
3. **Last name/** Family name or surname.
4. **Address/** The place where a person lives.
5. **Zip code/** A group of numbers that shows a specific area for mail delivery.
6. **Telephone number/** A number used to call someone by phone.
7. **Email address/** A name used to send and receive electronic messages.
8. **Student/** A person who studies at a school, college, or university.
9. **ID card/** An identification card that shows who you are.
10. **The circulation desk/** is the place in a library where people borrow and return books
