Past continuous (I was doing)

A) Form of Past continuous:-

he/she/it + was+ verb + ing+ complement.

- I was living in Hong Kong.

we/you/they were+ verb + ing+ complement.

- they were playing football.

B) Uses of the Past continuous:-

- 1- I was doing something = I was in the middle of doing it at a certain time. The action or situation started before this time, but had not finished: e.g.
 - This time last year I was living in Hong Kong.
 - What were you doing at 10 o'clock last night?
 - I waved to Helen, but she wasn't looking.
- 2- You can say that something happened (past simple) in the middle of something else (past continuous) e.g.,
 - Matt phoned while we were having dinner.
 - It was raining when I got up.
 - I saw you in the park yesterday. You were sitting on the grass and reading a book.
 - I hurt my back while I was working in the garden.
- 3- we use the past simple to say that one thing happened after another:-
- I was walking along the road when I saw Dan. So I stopped, and we talked for a while

C)Compare I was doing (past continuous) and I did (past simple)

was doing (= in the middle of an action)

We were walking home when I met Dan

We walked home after the party

(in the middle of walking home) .

(= all the way, completely)

Kate was watching TV when we arrived.

Kate watched TV a lot when she was ill last year.

D) Verbs that are not used in the continuous:-

Some verbs (for example, know and want) are not normally used in continuous forms (is + -ing, was + -ing etc.)

Like, want, need, prefer, know, realize, understand, recognize, believe, suppose, remember, mean, belong, fit, contain, consist, seem

- We were good friends. We knew each other well. (not we were knowing)

- I was -enjoying the party, but Chris wanted to go home. (not was wanting
